

Jinko Solar Water Resources Management Policy

Version: 2026V1.1

1. Overview

Jinko Solar Co., Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as “Jinko Solar” or “the Company”) strictly complies with global conventions and initiatives, including the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 6: Clean Water and Sanitation). It also complies with the Water Law of the People’s Republic of China, the Water Pollution Prevention and Control Law of the People’s Republic of China, the Regulations on Water Conservation, and all laws, regulations and policy requirements relating to water resource protection in the jurisdictions where it operates in China and overseas. The Company has formulated the Jinko Solar Water Resources Management Policy (hereinafter referred to as this “Policy”) to set out its commitments, principles and positions on water resource management.

The Company commits to proactively fulfilling its corporate social responsibility throughout its global operations, strictly regulating water resource management in its own operations and supply chain, continuously enhancing the standardization and transparency of water resource management, and advancing its global water resource management practices.

2. Scope of Application

This Policy applies to all business and operational activities of the Company and its branches and subsidiaries. The Company encourages all directors, members of senior management and employees, as well as value chain partners (including service providers, suppliers and business partners), to follow this Policy and jointly promote efficient water resource management. This Policy also applies to the Company’s mergers, acquisitions and other business transactions, as well as due diligence activities, worldwide. The Company is also committed to exercising its influence over non-controlled joint ventures and encouraging them to act in accordance with this Policy.

3. Publication Statement

The Risk Compliance and ESG Management Committee is responsible for version control of this Policy and the commitments herein. The Group Safety Committee Office, the COO Office and other relevant departments track annual management progress and conduct reviews and updates. The Board of Directors, as the highest decision-making and oversight body, reviews and confirms the Policy, and its publication has been endorsed by the

Board of Directors and senior management. As a general rule, this Policy is reviewed annually to ensure that it remains current and applicable. This Policy is prepared in both Chinese and English. In the event of any inconsistency between the two versions, the Chinese version shall prevail. This Policy is publicly available in the ESG section of Jinko Solar's website, and key stakeholders are informed through emails, meetings, online notifications and other means.

4. Commitments and Targets

The Company commits to proactively fulfilling its corporate social responsibility throughout its global operations. It formulates overarching water resource management policies, targets and action plans; strengthens water resource management across the Company; and promotes water conservation and water security actions among supply chain enterprises, thereby continuously enhancing the standardization and transparency of water resource management. The Company strives to reduce water waste and pollution, improve water use efficiency, respect every person's right to sufficient, safe and clean water and sanitation, and apply sound management practices to support the resilience and sustainability of water resources in the face of natural risks and opportunities.

The Company conducts water-use inventories covering all production bases and has established professional teams to carefully review the entire water withdrawal, use and discharge process at each base, ensuring accurate data for every stage. On this basis, the Company has set science-based water resource management targets: with 2022 as the baseline year, reduce water withdrawal per unit of photovoltaic-related product by 15% by the end of 2027 and by 20% by the end of 2030.

The Company also encourages suppliers to continuously reduce their operational dependence on and consumption of water resources, increase water recycling rates, and prioritize community water security and the prevention and control of transboundary pollution. By the end of 2027, the Company commits to expanding supplier practices to cover biodiversity risk and water stress management and to conducting biodiversity risk screening and water stress testing for more than 73% of its key suppliers.

5. Actions and Practices

5.1 Water Resource Management Structure

The Company's senior management is fully involved in water resource management. The Board of Directors serves as the highest decision-making and oversight body for water resource management. The Strategy and Sustainable Development Committee, a specialized committee under the Board, exercises day-to-day oversight and provides guidance on the Board's behalf, decides on material water resource management matters, oversees

the development of related policies and targets, and continuously drives performance improvement.

The Company has established the Risk Compliance and ESG Management Committee, chaired by the General Manager. Under the Committee's framework, the COO guides the strategic direction of water resource management at the operational level, while the CPO guides the strategic direction at the supply chain level. The Secretariat of the Risk Compliance and ESG Management Committee coordinates and manages ESG matters, including water resource management. A dedicated Water Resource Management Working Group has also been established under the Committee. The Supply Chain Management Department, Traceability Management Department, Group Safety Committee Office and other relevant departments promote water risk identification and analysis across the value chain and carry out water conservation actions at all production bases and among key suppliers.

5.2 Strengthening the Management of the Operational Water Footprint

The Company assesses water-related dependencies and impacts across all production bases and key suppliers. It actively identifies and manages other environmental matters relating to water resources or water security, such as soil and sediment retention and runoff regulation, and maintains a list of key bases in water-stressed areas. The Company conducts regular water footprint assessments at these key bases and develops and implements water conservation actions, achieving 100% action coverage for water conservation plans in water-stressed areas. It also attaches great importance to routine water management, strengthens water withdrawal permit management, prohibits excessive or uncontrolled water withdrawal, and ensures that water withdrawal complies with regional total water-use control targets and basin water allocation plans. Across all production bases, the Company strengthens water-use monitoring and control, undertakes key water conservation system optimization and innovation projects, prioritizes water-efficient equipment and fixtures, develops internal water recycling networks, continuously improves water use efficiency, promotes water recycling and reuse across multiple scenarios, and reduces reliance on freshwater resources.

For wastewater treatment, the Company deploys advanced wastewater treatment technologies and management systems at all production bases, identifies and progressively reduces or eliminates hazardous chemicals in wastewater, ensures that discharged water quality exceeds local regulatory requirements, prevents non-compliant discharge, and protects against water pollution. To reduce the water footprint of its products, the Company also monitors the water-related dependencies and impacts of product manufacturing and continuously reduces water consumption per unit of product by optimizing production techniques and processes.

5.3 Supply Chain Water Resource Management

The Jinko Solar Supply Chain Partner Code of Conduct sets out clear water resource management requirements for suppliers, and the Company has developed medium- and long-term plans for supply chain water resource management. The first stage consists of a baseline assessment to understand the current state of suppliers' water resource management and select leading suppliers for in-depth engagement and site visits. The second stage combines on-site assessments with audits and includes periodic sharing of water conservation practices to engage more supply chain partners in water conservation actions. The third stage deepens supplier enablement by providing supply chain enterprises with technical and management support to help them achieve their water resource management targets. In addition, the Company conducts annual supply chain water risk assessments, analyzes the watersheds in which key suppliers operate, and works with suppliers in high-risk areas to explore water risk response measures and build an environmentally responsible value chain.

5.4 Community and Environmental Protection

The safe management and use of community water resources is essential. The Company pays close attention to water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), proactively maintains constructive community relations regarding water use, and helps ensure access to safe water and sanitation at workplaces and in local communities, thereby protecting the health and safety of employees and community residents. The Company also values water quality and watershed protection. It takes measures to protect water bodies at and around its operating locations and neighboring communities from pollution, preserve ecosystems, and support access to clean drinking water. It actively responds to local and watershed-level policies and action plans and collaborates with public-sector bodies to support water conservation initiatives and help protect water resources and aquatic environments across watersheds.

5.5 Continuous Improvement

Employee Training and Stakeholder Awareness: Raise awareness among employees and external stakeholders of water security and the importance of water resource management, provide water resource management training, and promote knowledge of water resource protection;

Investment and Innovation: Continue investing in innovative water resource management technologies and practices to improve water use efficiency and reduce the adverse environmental impacts of water use;

Monitoring and Improvement: Regularly monitor and assess water resource management performance at production bases and among key suppliers, as well as progress toward annual water security and management

targets, and drive continuous improvement;

Enhanced Transparency: Actively participate in the CDP Water Security questionnaire and strengthen oversight, engagement and communication with internal and external stakeholders on water resource management.
